Embed physical activity into the school day through encouraging active break times, running the daily mile, holding active lessons and offering a variety of before and after school clubs (KI1)	<p>All children will be involved in 2 PE lessons a week with Sports Coach and teacher.</p> <p>Sports Coach will run sports clubs before or after school every day and vary these sports across the year.</p> <p>All classes will take part in the Daily Mile, have at least one allocated day to use the outside fitness equipment and have access to playground/field at playtimes and lunch times and during the day for active lesson opportunities.</p>	£10,000 for Sports Coach (partially funded by income from before and after school clubs and Multi Sport Holiday Camps)	<p>New PE scheme has added a wider range of skills into the curriculum.</p> <p>Sports Coach keeps a record of the daily mile totals and has been able to challenge children to push themselves to increase their laps.</p>	<p>We will look to continue offering the before and after school clubs. Participation numbers will be monitored to allow as many children to participate as possible.</p> <p>All groups of children will be catered for within the clubs.</p> <p>We will continue to increase the amount of time that the children are participating in the daily mile.</p>

<p>Actively encourage pupils to take on leadership or volunteer roles that support the delivery of sport and physical activity within the school (such as 'sport leader' or peer-mentoring schemes)</p> <p>(K12)</p>	<p>Sports Coach and PE lead to send Sports Leader application forms home to Year 2 children in Autumn term. Once selected they will support with playtimes and lunchtimes to encourage physical activity. They will support with level 1 and level 2 competitions.</p>	<p>£701.36 for equipment and resources for inside and outside</p>	<p>Children are proud to be Sports Leaders, and encourage others to play fairly and take part in more activities. They are good role models for others.</p>	<p>Sports leaders appointed in the Autumn term and will meet more regularly with the Sports Coach to develop ideas. Then they will have the opportunity to implement these with their peers.</p>
<p>Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport</p> <p>(K13)</p>	<p>The PE Lead will use the new scheme 'Get Set 4 PE' to ensure all areas of PE are covered by blocking a particular area for each half term.</p> <p>The Sports Coach will teach the first lesson, then Teachers will teach the second lesson each week so that they have the chance to extend and embed their skills, knowledge and confidence.</p> <p>Sports coach to work with PE Lead and teachers to plan, teach and assess children in PE lessons.</p>	<p>Get Set 4 PE - £350</p>	<p>Children get the chance to embed, increase and develop physical skills each half term in a particular area.</p> <p>Teachers/Sports Coach can work together to support children who may need more coaching, or extend skills.</p> <p>'GetSet4PE' – all areas of the PE curriculum are covered and these are progressive from FS through to Year 2. Teachers are more confident and have the necessary resources and support to teach quality PE lessons.</p>	<p>To sustain the increased knowledge/skill of staff, the Sports Coach will continue to train and monitor staff in new sports / activities. With this support the teachers will be more confident in teaching PE going forward.</p> <p>Sports Coach has completed a Level 4 Certificate in Leadership and Management in Primary PE to support him further.</p>

<p>Ensure children are given the chance to try a range of sports across the year by offering a wide range of sports in PE lessons across the year.</p> <p>(K14)</p>	<p>Sports Coach will support staff in lessons to build knowledge and understanding in planning and teaching new sports.</p> <p>Visits from different sports clubs/experts will give children the opportunities to try new sports and explore/develop talents.</p>	<p>£1000</p>	<p>Children have had the opportunity to take part in a fencing PE lesson. They then were able to join a before school club in the Summer Term.</p> <p>Children took part in a sponsored fitness event to raise funds for new equipment. A motivational Olympian spoke to the children regarding her sport of canoeing.</p>	<p>To make sure that children continue to experience new activities, there will be an ongoing review of the curriculum to ensure that new sports are included.</p> <p>Financial restraints have meant our families are not as able to pay for external coaches. We are reviewing this to ensure children still get a wide range of opportunities before and after school.</p>
